



GENERAL LIGHTING GUIDE

BRIGHT DIRECT LIGHT

More than 1,000 foot-candles with several hours of direct sun
Direct sunlight that creates shadows with strong outlines. Generally from a south-facing window or a west-facing window in the afternoon.

BRIGHT INDIRECT LIGHT

More than 1,000 foot-candles
Diffused sunlight that creates shadows with defined but soft edges. Generally from a south-facing window with sheer curtains.

MEDIUM LIGHT

Approximately 250-1,000 foot-candles
Lighting that creates shadows with visible but very diffused edges. Generally from an east-facing window or several feet from a south-facing window.

LOW LIGHT

Approximately 50-250 foot-candles
Light that creates diffused shadows with no defined edges. Generally from a north-facing window or towards the interior of a room.
